




About Piven

The colorful and witty collages of illustrator <u>Hanoch Piven</u> have appeared throughout the last 25 years on both sides of the Atlantic: in most major American magazines and newspapers such as Time, Newsweek, Rolling Stone and in many European publications such as Esquire UK, Welt Woche or Der Spiegel. A nationally and internationally distinguished artist, Piven's artwork is in the permanent collection of The Prints and Photographs Division of The Library of Congress in Washington DC.

Piven has also created a great collection of children books, including the award-winning book, "What Presidents Are Made of", which was chosen by Time Magazine as one of the best books of 2004. He is also the creator of Parents' Choice Award winning Apps (Faces iMake, Right Brain Creativity), as well as of TV programs for Israel's Educational TV and other channels. About The Lecture and Workshop

In addition to his work as an artist and illustrator, Piven has emerged as an inspiring lecturer and educator, visiting schools and leading workshops all over the world. By working with the whole community of students, teachers, and families, Piven brings the message that creativity and playfulness are important tools in which individual self reflection and growth are possible. The workshop encourages creativity, communication and self-reflection through the creation of collages with common everyday objects.

Why is this important for a school?

Piven communicates and demonstrates in his lectures and art workshops some simple yet clear and important points all necessary in the contemporary world:

- Everyone can be creative
- We need creativity not just for making art
- Visual communication can be used outside of the art room
- Playfulness and art open a safe space in which we can gain awareness to our own needs and abilities

General guidelines

- Every visit to a school is adapted to serve the specific needs of the school.
- Each workshop takes between 90 to 120 minutes, depending on the age group.
- A school visit can include up to three lectures or workshops per school day.
- A lecture to a large general assembly is encouraged and is efficient.
- The workshop and lecture are very relevant for high school students as well.
- An activity in the afternoon/evening for parents and/or teachers is a recommended option.
- The school is responsible for collecting materials based on a provided list at the very end of this document.

List of Materials needed for Hanoch Piven's Workshop:

A projector and speakers to connect to a laptop are needed for the first part of the workshop.

1-Each participant (or group) should have a base to work on. Something thick and sturdy. **A thick sturdy** board, (cardboard or foamcore).

Size at least 11×17 inch. (around 30×50 cm) for individual or at least 17×24 inches (around 50×70 cm) for a group.

2- At the center of a room there should be a large table with all the materials, paraphernalia and objects to use. This is the "buffet". Anything (clean and safe) can be in the buffet: old broken toys, combs, hairpins, computer parts, buttons, screws, old photos, little figures, feathers, screws, nails, etc.

It is important to stay away from the usual arts and crafts materials. Please no pipe cleaners and other usual suspects. New unexpected objects will create a new experience.

It is suggested to have the objects (the bits and pieces) somewhat sorted.

Please, tell the students and staff to start collecting weeks in advance!

This will create a lot of enthusiasm and positive energy in advance.

- 3. A variety of colored papers will also be very useful. Since the participants won't be using paint and brushes, they can use color paper to create colored backgrounds and shapes.
- 4- One set of general working tools could be good to have around (hammer, Xcto knife, plyers and wire) + one set of fast drying epoxy glue is good to have as well just in case.

Materials for each table where people work. (suggesting tables of 6-8, no chairs needed)

- 5- One or two pairs of scissors
- 6- White plastic glue
- 7- Hot glue guns. (at least one for every four participants)

(It is important to make sure that each table has access to an electrical plug, and it is recommended to tape the extension cables to the floor)

- 8- Silicon glue sticks to put in each gun
- 9- Plastic bowls to collect stuff from the 'buffet' and bring it to the table.
